2. The poem "After Apple-Picking" basically describes human life. Do you agree? 10
3. In what ways does Stowe present the incompatibility of slavery with the Christian ethic of love and tolerance? Analyse how the novel's Christ figures underscore the novel's basic Christian messages. 10
4. Discuss the symbolism of the tree in "All My Sons." What does the fallen tree represent, and how does its presence contribute to the play's overall themes? Analyze the tree's significance in relation to the characters' guilt, responsibility, and attempts to bury the past. 10
5. Write short notes of *any two* of the following: 5×2=10
 - a) The Quakers
 - b) Simon Legree
 - c) Eva
 - d) Miss Ophelia
6. Analyze the role of literature during the Harlem Renaissance. How did writers such as Langston Hughes, Zora Neale Hurston, and Claude McKay use their works to explore themes of racial identity, social justice, and the African American experience? Discuss the impact of their writings on both the movement and American literature as a whole. 10
7. Explore the role of women in literature during the American Civil War. Discuss how female writers such as Harriet Beecher Stowe in *Uncle Tom's Cabin* depicted the experiences of women during the war, their contributions to the war effort. 10
