- Write an essay on the significance and need of Global Justice in the 21<sup>st</sup> century. Develop your essay in the backdrop of different theories of Global Justice.
- 2. Jeremy Bentham's late 18th century Utilitarian theory summed up as "the greatest good for the greatest number" is often used today under the name of "cost-benefit analysis." The application of the same can be seen in contemporary examples where corporations used this theory which required assigning a dollar value on human lives to make important business decisions. This leads to a discussion about the objections to Utilitarianism: is it fair to give more weight to the values of a majority, even when the values of the majority may be ignoble or inhumane?

  In view of the above described facts, Critically discuss the theory of Utilitarianism.
- 3. During the Civil War, men were conscripted to fight in the war but draftees were allowed to pay hired substitutes to fight in their place. The debate arises in regards this policy an example of free-market exchange? Or was it a form of coercion, because the lower class surely had more of a financial incentive to serve? This leads to a classroom debate about the contemporary questions surrounding war and conscription. Is today's voluntary army really voluntary, given that many recruits come from a disproportionately lower economic background? What role does patriotism play? And what are the obligations of citizenship? Is there a civic duty to serve one's country?

Write an essay on the topic of Law and Morality in the backdrop of above given statement. Emphasize your views on the relation between Markets and Morals.

 Write an essay on 'Affirmative action' stating your side of the argument.
